COLLEGE & CAREER READINESS (CCR)

(Formerly known as GEDTM)

Individuals interested in obtaining a High School Equivalency (HSE) should contact **252-451-8246**, or visit www.nashcc.edu/ccr for more information.

College and Career Readiness classes are offered on-campus and off-campus at No Fee to individuals age 16 and older. Minors (ages 16 - 17) must first complete a minor packet and interview prior to registering for orientation.

Orientation & Registration Requirements

1. Space availability is limited and is first come/first serve.
2. Complete placement testing before enrolling in College and Career Readiness classes.

Advisement and Placement Procedure

The registration process consists of placement testing, then attendance in a Ready, Set, Go Orientation class.

Ready, Set, Go Orientation

Ready, Set, Go is a required course that prepares incoming CCR students to be successful in the program. Students will be given useful strategies to help them become successful. They will also be presented with career planning strategies to help them work toward their career goals while/after earning their diploma. After completing Ready, Set, Go, students will be better prepared to achieve success in their CCR courses and beyond.

On-Campus Classes

The CCR Department is offering many classes in a hybrid format. Students will complete work assigned by teachers online, and can also attend face-to-face classes.

College and Career Readiness Honors Boot Camp

Boot Camp is a five-week multi-subject course that integrates the Social Studies, Reading, Writing, Science, and Math skills necessary to pass the HSE examinations. Students will attend classes daily, take practice tests in the Learning Lab as the week progresses, and then take the official HSE examinations each Thursday night or Friday morning. Because of the fast-paced nature of this course, perfect attendance, and adequate placement test scores are required. In-person.

Foundational Reading/Writing

This course is focused on building a strong

foundation in reading, composition, and grammar. Emphasis is placed on the foundations of reading comprehension, vocabulary development, critical analysis, reading rate, and the composition of clear, organized, grammatically correct assignments.

Foundational Math

This course will develop skills in whole numbers. Upon completion, students will have gained a deeper understanding of basic math fundamentals.

ABE I & II Reading/Writing

This course is a fully integrated approach to teaching reading, composition, and grammar. Emphasis is placed on reading comprehension, vocabulary development, critical analysis, reading rate, and the composition of clear, organized, grammatically correct assignments.

HSE Writing

This course will develop and refine grammar skills and, in the process, prepare students for the essay portion of the online assessment for the High School Equivalency Exam.

ABE Math I & II

These courses will develop skills in whole numbers, order of operations, decimals, proportions, percentages, and integers. Upon completion, students will have gained a deeper understanding of the intermediate math fundamentals.

HSE Math I & II

This course will develop skills in algebraic problem-solving including expressions, polynomials, quadratic equations, linear equalities, and functions using workbooks and Khanacademy.org. Upon completion, students will have gained a deeper understanding of working with signed numbers, performing operations with rational and irrational numbers, combining like terms in algebraic expressions, writing and solving algebraic expressions and equations, solving word problems through the use of algebraic reasoning, and solving geometric problems. Students who complete this course should be prepared to take the Math HSE examination.

HSE Fast Track

Fast Track classes are designed to reinforce skills at a fast pace in preparation for the High School Equivalency exams, including GED® and HiSET®. The integrated content includes targeted instruction in all HSE subject areas.

Online

CCR will be offering online programming and classes to include: self-paced assignments, and recorded instruction.

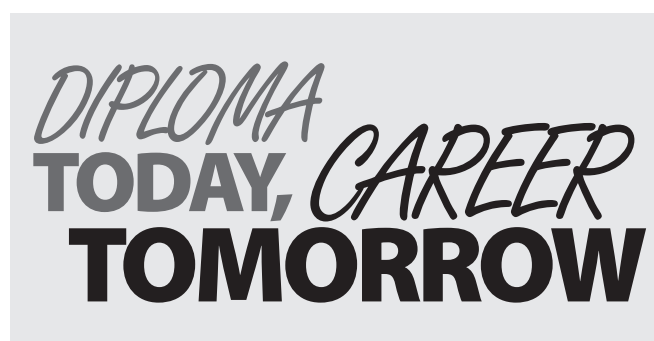

COMPUTER TRAINING CLASSES

Hardware/Software Support (A+ Certification - Part I) Concurrent w/ CTS 120- 1SOL1C | \$130 Online

This is the first of two courses to prepare students to take the A+ certification exam. This course covers the basic hardware of a personal computer, including installation, operations and interactions with software. Topics include component identification, memory-system, peripheral installation and configuration, preventive maintenance, hardware diagnostics/repair, installation and optimization of system software, commercial programs, system configuration, and device-drivers. Upon completion, students should be able to select appropriate computer equipment and software, upgrade/maintain existing equipment and software, and troubleshoot/repair non-functioning personal computers.

Advanced Hardware/Software Support (A+ Certification Part II) - Concurrent with CTS-220-2SOL1C | \$130 | Online

Prerequisite: CTS 120

This course provides advanced knowledge and competencies in hardware and operating system technologies for computer technicians to support personal computers. Emphasis is placed on: configuring and upgrading; diagnosis and troubleshooting; as well as preventive maintenance of hardware and system software. Upon completion, students should be able to install, configure, diagnose, perform preventive maintenance, and maintain basic networking on personal computers.

Introduction to Computers (C) - Concurrent with CIS-110-OL01C | \$185 | Online

This course introduces computer concepts, including fundamental functions and operations of the computer. Topics include identification of hardware components, basic computer operations, security issues, and use of software applications. Upon completion, students should be able to demonstrate an understanding of the role and function of computers and use the computer to solve problems. This course is not intended for a computer novice; this course involves multiple concepts and is a fast-paced introduction to software applications. This course has been approved for transfer under the Comprehensive Articulation Agreement as a general education course in Mathematics (Quantitative Option).

Introduction to Networks (C) - Concurrent with NET-125-B60C | \$185 | Tuesday/Thursday/Online

This course introduces the networking field. Emphasis is placed on network terminology and protocols, local area networks, wide area networks, OSI model, cabling, router programming, Ethernet, IP addressing, and network standards. Upon completion, students should be able to perform tasks related to networking mathematics,

terminology, and models, media, Ethernet, subnetting, and TCP/IP Protocols.

Introduction to Web Graphics (C) - Concurrent with WEB-111-OL01C | \$185 | Online

This course introduces the creation of web graphics and addressing problems peculiar to WWW display using appropriate software. Topics include web graphics file types, optimization, RGB color, web typography, elementary special effects, transparency, animation, slicing, basic photo manipulation, and other related topics. Upon completion, students should be able to create graphics such as animated banners, buttons, backgrounds, logos, and manipulate photographic images for Web delivery.

Microsoft Excel (C) - Concurrent with Spreadsheets CTS-130-OL01C | \$185 | Online

This course introduces basic spreadsheet design and development. Topics include writing formulas, using functions, enhancing spreadsheets, creating charts, and printing. Upon completion, students should be able to design and print basic spreadsheets and charts.

Linux/UNIX Single User (C) - Concurrent w/ NOS 120 - OL01C) | \$185 | Online

This course develops the necessary skills for students to develop both GUI and command line skills for using and customizing a Linux workstation. Topics include Linux file system and access permissions, GNOME Interface, VI editor, X Window System expression pattern matching, I/O redirection, network and printing utilities. Upon completion, students should be able to customize and use Linux systems for command line requirements and desktop productivity roles.

Windows Single User (C) - Concurrent with NOS-130-OL01C \$185 | Online

This course introduces operating system concepts for single-user systems. Topics include hardware management, file and memory management, system configuration/optimization, and utilities. Upon completion, students should be able to perform operating systems functions at the support level in a single-user environment.

Introduction to Cybersecurity (Concurrent w/ Security Concepts - SEC 110 - OL60C) | \$185 | Online

This course introduces the concepts and issues related to securing information systems and the development of policies to implement information security controls. Topics include the historical view of networking and security, security issues, trends, security resources, and the role of policy, people, and processes in information security. Upon completion, students should be able to identify information security risks, create an information security policy, and identify processes to implement and enforce Policy.

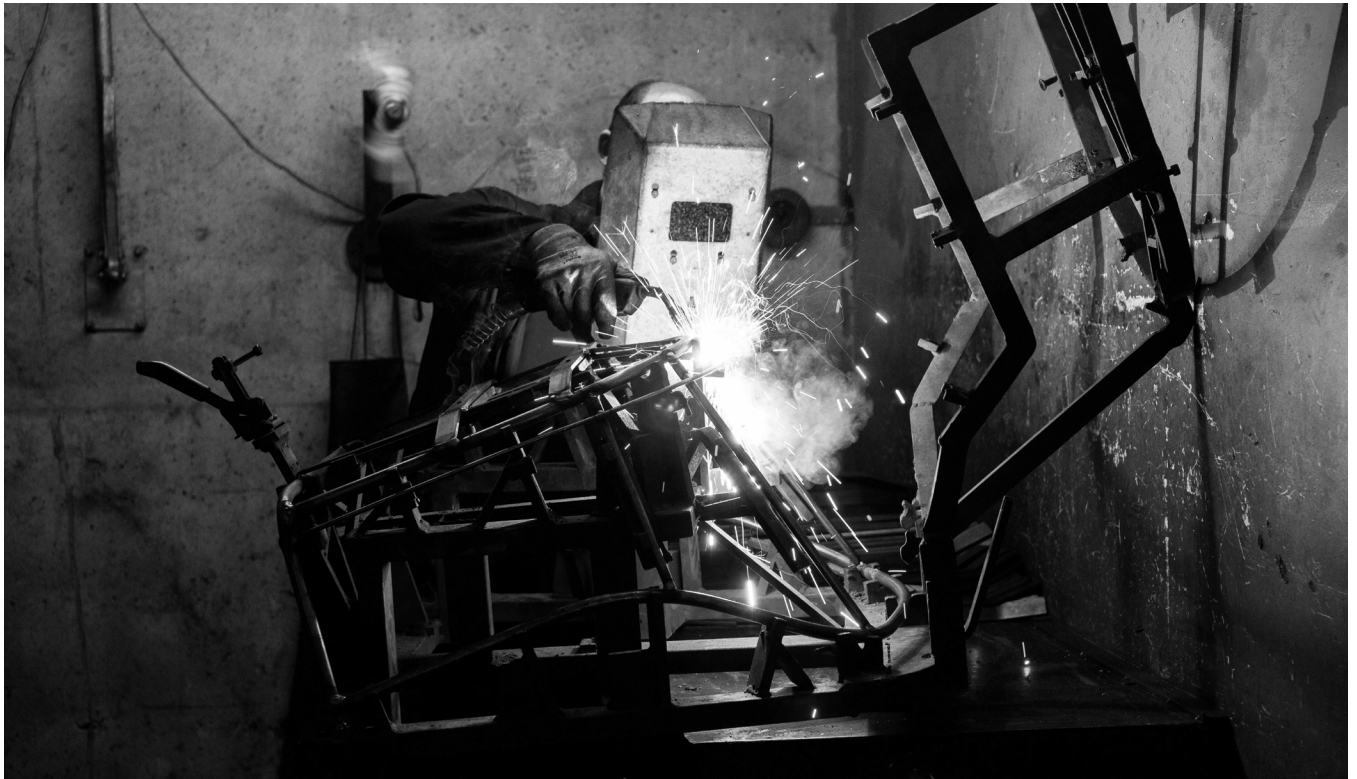

As a result of the wide variety of classes offered, the specific attendance requirement varies by class and will include 100/90/80% attendance of total class hours. Students may contact coned@nashcc.edu or **252-451-8216** to confirm the attendance requirement for a Continuing Education class. If a class is canceled or postponed, students who have pre-registered will be contacted prior to the start time of the class.

Cancellation Of Classes

Classes may be canceled if a minimum number of students do not pre-register. Pre-Registered students will be contacted and the registration fee will be refunded.

Refund & Withdrawal Policy

100% refund - Student officially withdraws prior to first class. 75% refund - Student officially withdraws prior to, or on, the 10% point.
