Ready, Set, Go is a required course that prepares incoming CCR students to be successful in the program. Students will be given useful strategies to help them become successful. They will also be presented with career planning strategies to help them work toward their career goals while/after earning their diploma. After completing Ready, Set, Go, students will be better prepared to achieve success in their CCR courses and beyond.

On-Campus Classes

The CCR Department offers morning and evening classes. Morning classes are from 8 AM-1 PM and evening classes are from 6 PM- 8:30 PM.

**College And Career Readiness
Honors Boot Camp**

This is a fast track, multi-subject course that integrates the Social Studies, Reading, Writing, Science, and Math skills necessary to pass the HSE examinations. Students will attend classes daily, take practice tests in the Learning Lab and as the weeks progress they will complete their HiSet testing. Because of the fast-paced nature of this course, perfect attendance, and adequate placement test scores are required. In-person.

Foundational Adult Basic Education

This course is focused on building a strong foundation in reading comprehension, and workforce literacy. Emphasis is placed on the foundations of reading comprehension, vocabulary development, critical analysis, and the composition of clear, organized, grammatically correct assignments. This course will also develop skills in whole numbers.

ABE & HSE Reading/Writing

This course is a fully integrated approach to teaching reading, composition, and grammar. Emphasis is placed on reading comprehension, vocabulary development, critical analysis, reading rate, and the composition of clear, organized, grammatically correct assignments. Students will also prepare for the essay portion of the online assessment for the High School Equivalency Exam.

ABE Math

These courses will develop skills in whole numbers, order of operations, decimals, proportions, percentages, and integers. Upon completion, students will have gained a deeper understanding of the intermediate math fundamentals.

HSE Math

This course will develop skills in algebraic problem-solving including expressions, polynomials, quadratic equations, linear equalities, and functions. Upon completion, students will have gained a deeper understanding of working with signed numbers, performing operations with rational and irrational numbers, combining like terms in algebraic expressions, writing and solving algebraic expressions and equations, solving word problems through the use of algebraic reasoning, and solving geometric problems.
